
Brothers, sisters et al – 2009 May my LAST Haranguing Hurrah!


Not a New Rant



- ➢ What if the real bubble hasn't even burst yet?
- What if our "very best" economists keep getting it wrong on a wish and a prayer for wealth– Greenspan, etcetera.

What if economists in control, and those new thinkers coming out of "top" schools, even those considered brainy and avant garde, have been and are only capable of tinkering with a system that obviously never really worked, and will never work? Sure, a handful may figure a way to milk more profits, temporarily. We the people seem to be voting for those who promise to work just such capitalist mathematical miracles - screw the environment.

The U.S. powers-that-be are cranking out paper money like never before with only a wish and a prayer to back up that new debt. It is like the world's largest Ponzi scheme ever- *trillions of dollars* making **Bernie Madoff** look like an amateur. Bond, bill, note buybacks for reissue is a crazy way to further increase debt to keep the capitalist consumer cycle hobbling along. US envoys will be negotiating continuously with China and others to convince them to carry on re-financing debt owed until the jig is up. CNBC- Power Lunch, Street Squawk, Fast Money, Closing Bell, & assorted market watch TV- The Pack, Your \$\$\$\$\$, In The Money, The Help Desk with Gerri Willis, Jim Crammer's Stop Trading (especially), on and on - all of them have sounded like a whacky pack of cheerleaders this past year and have just plain consistently had it and continue week by week today to have it wrong, since the meltdown started. Why should we listen to them anymore? Our political leaders and those south of the border and in the EU are still dead keen to **grow the economy** – to get **everyone** back working full time to produce stuff so that they have money to buy more stuff and pay taxes.

Canada will go down with the USA - We can no longer keep people "fully" employed making stuff and destroying the human habitable environment. By the books, the USA owes Canada \$11 Billion dollars, but in actual fact it is now closer to \$99bn while owing a total of \$8+ trillion world wide. (California has never even paid back \$260+ million in energy debt to BC Hydro). U.S. housing prices continue to decline. The average home mortgaged for \$600,000 is now worth less than \$300,000. The ARP program will eventually fall apart, as the government is taking on more and more re-cycled debt through the owners assistance program **www.hud.gov**. Obama's promise of national health care will add hundreds of billions to deficit & debt, sinking them even deeper. The USA's ability to grow enough nutritious food is collapsing due to drought and soon enough peak oil fuel and fertilizer costs. Keeping a starving world at bay will require even more military spending. All of this is happening right now, not off in the future. AND our leaders and theirs continue to promote market recovery to the point where **everyone** is employed 35 hours per week.

Youth today who did everything right, toed the party line and "got themselves a darn fine expensive book larnin' education" in the olde skills soon to be ever more useless, now find jobs scarce and will eventually find them relatively non-existent.



Environmental Costs - MASSIVE

Not covered in all of this or the documentary *I.O.U.S.A.* is, that all of these attempts to keep funding our way of life do not even take into account the costs of crumbling infrastructure – sewage and water, saving the air we breathe, water we drink, land we live on and our food supply. Waiting in the wings for cash- in 2005 the EPA estimated State mining clean-up costs, which will soon turn into a national catastrophe- Montana \$3+ trillion; California \$2+ trillion; Pennsylvania, Texas, New York, Illinois \$1+ trillion each (*Collapse: How Societies Choose...* - Jared Diamond)

Over 100 nuclear power plants supply 20% of U.S. energy -3 out 4 must too soon be decommissioned due to old age but alternate energy sources will never come close to replacing fossil fuel dictating a need for new atomic energy plants. At the moment, cheerleader Obama is touting clean coal. (Three top books all agree that clean coal energy is an oxymoron. Monbiot shows best why it and tar sands will always be a net dirty source.)

On top of all of this, will be sharply mounting costs of climate related damage- tornadoes, hurricanes, rain related flooding, escalating forest firestorms and related property damage, food loss related to plant disease and drought due to loss of glacial and snow pack runoff and . Worst of all is the fact our seas are dying partially due to carbolic acidification, partly to massive overfishing, (the major source of world dietary protein will soon enough run out – ouch!) Climate induced health care costs of pandemic disease are set to break out from the pen and coop.

Canadians through many hundreds of billions of tax dollars, will soon enough have to clean up old abandoned mines and deadly toxic waste sites stored in "perma"frost mine shafts now melting, as well as the growing deadly massive tar sands ponds.

Some will question my qualifications. I have no official economics course credits of any kind. Since "retiring" I have read much of the basics including Hazlett's *Economics in One Easy Lesson* (54 pages), John Locke –*Concise Encyclopedia on Economics and Liberty*, David Hume's *Treatise on Human Nature*, AND Adam Smith's *Wealth of Nations*. I've also read Marx's *Communist Manifesto*.

In college, I read and believed **Alvin Toffler's** *Future Shock*. He warned in 1970, that with the coming industrial technological conversion to robot assisted production, there would be far less work. He advised society to begin the transition to an 18 hour or less work week. This he predicted would free up lots of time useful for adult "betterment" education, volunteerism, recreation, and fitness. If everyone was employed "part time",

Unemployment deductions would be un-necessary. Crime incarceration, physical and mental health costs due to unemployment would be significantly reduced, lowering deductions from pay cheques and income tax. As it is today in 2009, crime is now on the rise. You may have a full time job but those many who don't will start to redistribute your wealth through your car and home windows, even on the street at the point of a gun. More police is not the answer. I reaffirm that belief in his ideas today because he was right.

At UBC I read Toffler's *Third Wave* and reaffirm my belief in his idea's, almost all of which have so far come to fruition.

In the past five years I have re-read or read a number of **Che Guevara's** and **Fidel's** economic writings as well as a number of books that are perhaps far more important than any economics bibles – those listed on page 4.

There is no possible algorithm that can work to perpetuate the consumer society's status quo or even a tiny subset of it. You do the math – especially **Dad, Chris, Steve and Jin** then get back to us with that **magical mathematic solution to relieve concerns.**



As it is there are far too few of us "crazies" reading, thinking and howling in the growing wasteland of deaf ears – many of those no doubt damaged by loud iPods.

"Economics is the science which studies human behaviour as a relationship between ends and scarce means which have alternative uses." Lord Roberts

"They say astrology was invented to give the impression that economics is an exact science. Economists never know tomorrow why the predictions they made yesterday didn't pan out today. It's not their fault. Frankly, they've been left without much to do since the real economy closed up shop and made way for the virtual economy. Today, finance rules, and frenzy and speculation fall more into the bailiwick of psychiatrists then into that of economists.

"The Rothschilds learned of Napoleon's defeat at Waterloo by carrier pigeon. Now news travels faster than the speed of light, and flying alongside it on the computer screen is money. A ring worthy of Saturn spins wildly around the earth: the \$2,000,000,000,000 that move on world financial markets every day. Of all those many zeros, so many you get dizzy looking at them, only a miniscule portion of this 2 trillion dollars corresponds to commercial transactions or productive investments. In 1997, of every \$100 in currency transactions, only \$2.50 had anything to do with the exchange of goods and services. That same year, on the eve of the hurricane that battered stock markets in Asia and the world, the Malaysian government suggested a commonsense measure: outlawing currency trading for noncommercial purposes. The shouting of floor traders makes a lot of noise, and understandably those who benefit from currency speculation were deaf to the idea. In 1995, only three of the ten largest fortunes in Japan were linked to the real economy. The other seven multimillionaires were speculators.

"Ten years ago, in 1988, the financial markets suffered another collapse. Distinguished U.S. economists from the White House, the Congress, and the New York and Chicago stock exchanges tried to explain what happened. The word "speculation" was not uttered in any of their analysis. After all, popular sports deserve respect: five out of every ten North Americans play the stock market in one way or another. Just as "smart bombs" killed Iraqis in the Gulf war without anyone except the dead finding out, "smart money" earns 40 percent profits without anyone finding out how. Wall Street, is today the centre of the great global electronic gambling den, and all of humanity is enslaved by the decisions made there. The virtual economy moves capital, trashes prices, plucks fools, ruins countries (third world), and churns out millionaires and mendicants in the time it takes to say, "Amen."

"The world may be obsessed with personal insecurity, but reality teaches us that the crimes of the finance capital are far more fearsome than those we read about in the papers. Mark Mobius [UPDATE - today's Bernie Madoff], who speculates on behalf of thousands off investors, told the German magazine *Der Spiegel* at the beginning of 1998, "My clients laugh at ethical criteria. They only want us to increase their profits." During the crisis of 1987, another phrase made him famous: "You've got to buy when blood runs in the streets, even if the blood is mine." Gorge Soros, the most successful speculator in the world, who made a fortune successively bidding down the pound, the lira and the ruble, knows what he's talking about when he says, "The main enemy of the open society, I believe, is no longer the Communist but the capitalist threat."

"Capitalism's Dr. Frankenstein has created a monster that walks on its own, and nobody can stop it. It is a superstate over and above all others, an invisible power that governs us all even though it was elected by no one. In this world there is too much misery but there is also too much money and wealth doesn't know what to do with itself. In other times, finance capital broadened the consumer market by extending credit. It served the real economy, which to exist needed to grow. Today, utterly bloated, finance capital has put the productive system to work for it, while it plays with the real economy like a cat with a mouse.

"Every crash on the stock exchange is a catastrophe for small investors who swallowed the line and bet their life savings on the financial lottery. And it's a catastrophe for the poorer barrios of the global village, whose residents suffer the consequences without ever knowing what caused them: in a single blow each "market correction" empties their plates and wipes out their jobs. But rarely do crises on the stock exchange fatally wound the suffering millionaires who, day after day, backs bent over their computers, fingertips calloused from the keyboards, redistribute the world's wealth by moving money, setting interest rates, and deciding the value of labour, commodities, and currencies. They are the only workers who could refute the anonymous scribe who wrote on a wall in Montevideo: "*He who works has no time to make money.*" **Eduardo Galeano** – *Upside down a primer for the looking glass world* 1998 p.156-159 I've certainly included enough to offend just about everyone, so I will make this a last communication with family. No more haranguing emails or letters will follow. I will go quietly about Neo's business and leave you all to fly away on your own fundamental mission to leave little to those, even our own family like Daniel who follow in our massive mud-clomping footprints. All of my writings, emails and urgings to family since 2005 were meant to motivate others to get actively involved in spreading the word to peers and government.
